2. Information About Us

- 2.1 Our Site(s) is owned and operated by Just Simple Hosting a registered sole trader in England, whose registered address is East Sussex, Fairlight, TN35 4ED.

- 2.3 We are not directly regulated by any specific regulatory authority. However, we comply with all relevant UK laws and regulations, including those concerning data protection (as governed by the UK General Data Protection Regulation GDPR and the Data Protection Act 2018), consumer protection, and e-commerce regulations. We also follow industry best practices to ensure

the security, privacy, and integrity of the services we provide. In case our services fall within any specific regulated sectors in the future, we will notify users accordingly and provide relevant details regarding the regulatory authority overseeing such services.

3. What Does This Policy Cover?

This Privacy Policy applies only to your use of our site('s) and services.

Our site('s) may contain links to other websites. Please note that we have no control over how your data is collected, stored, or used by other websites and we advise you to check the privacy policies of any such websites before providing any data to them.

4. What Is Personal Data?

Personal data is defined by the UK GDPR and the Data Protection Act 2018 (collectively, "the Data Protection Legislation") as 'any information relating to an identifiable person who can be directly or indirectly identified in particular by reference to an identifier'.

9. How and Where Do You Store or Transfer My Personal Data?

We will only store your personal data or store some of your personal data in the UK. This means that it will be fully protected under the Data Protection Legislation.

We will only store your personal data or store some of your personal data within the European Economic Area (the "EEA"). The EEA consists of all EU member states, plus Norway, Iceland, and Liechtenstein. This means that your personal data will be fully protected under the EU GDPR and/or to equivalent standards by law. Transfers of personal data to the EEA from the UK are permitted without additional safeguards.

We may store some or all of your personal data in countries outside of the UK. These are known as "third countries". We will take additional steps in order to ensure that your personal data is treated just as safely and securely as it would be within the UK and under the Data Protection Legislation as follows:

We ensure that your personal data is protected under binding corporate rules. Binding corporate rules are a set of common rules which all our group companies are required to follow when processing personal data. For further information, please refer to the <u>Information Commissioner's Office</u>.

We will only store or transfer personal data in or to countries that are deemed to provide an adequate level of protection for personal data. For further information about adequacy decisions and adequacy regulations, please refer to the <u>Information</u> Commissioner's Office.

We will use specific approved contracts which ensure the same levels of personal data protection that apply under the Data Protection Legislation. For further information, please refer to the Information Commissioner's Office.

Normally, we aim to provide a complete response, including a copy of your personal data within that time. In some cases, however, particularly if your request is more complex, more time may be required up to a maximum of three months from the date we receive your request. You will be kept fully informed of our progress.
